Selection Process: 12 Board positions, with four (4) positions up for election each year. Terms are for three (3) years. The Nominating Committee selects candidates in September and ballots are mailed to the entire membership early in October. Votes are counted near the end of the month and candidates notified shortly thereafter. See the By-Laws in the Member Handbook for more details.

Responsibilities: Provide strategic and tactical direction to guide the operation of SJRYC to assure it successfully achieves its mission. Each Director must fairly represent all the membership, balance various member interests, and help assure the long term financial strength of SJRYC. Directors participate in monthly Board meetings and special meetings as required. They also participate in Club activities and interact with other members to stay abreast of their needs and views on how well SJRYC is achieving its mission. Directors promote SJRYC positively within the membership and community through friendliness and an inclusive atmosphere. Chairing or serving on committees for the enhancement of the Club and enjoyment of our members is also a key part of a Director's responsibilities.

Attributes: Directors must have the ability to work positively and constructively in a team environment. They must have vision and the ability to set the Club's direction and then craft a strategic plan to insure SJRYC's long term success. The Club is approximately a \$900,000 a year operation, so a solid understanding of general business practices/operations, marketing, accounting and facility management is definitely needed to effectively function as a Director. A personal interest in one or more of the Club's major activities of boating, swimming or social activities is also very helpful. Each Board candidate must be a Club member or the spouse or domestic partner of a member.

Application: Send a letter (one page or less) to the Nominating Committee, c/o Commodore Susan Greco, by September 15th. Include a photo and description of your background and applicable experience. State why you would like to be a member of the SJRYC Board and why you believe you would be a good candidate. 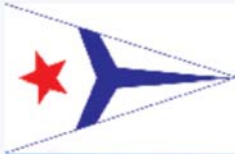

- By signing the sign-in sheet, people will agree to the terms of our new SJRYC Pool flyer.
