

## **Saint Joseph River Yacht Club**

2017 Rhumblin Regatta - Saturday, 10 June 2017

### Notice of Race and General Sailing Instructions

1. Rules: The regatta will be governed by the rules of the US Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing, except when changed by this Notice of Race and the Special Sailing Instructions.
2. Entry Procedure: Competitors enter by completing an entry form via ReggataNet at the link below: [https://www.regattanetwork.com/clubmgmt/applet\\_registration\\_form.php?regatta\\_id=14422](https://www.regattanetwork.com/clubmgmt/applet_registration_form.php?regatta_id=14422) and paying the entry fee online no later than 9 June 2017. Boats may also enter the day of the event and pay by credit card, cash, or check between 9:30AM and 10:00AM during Check-In at the main bar of the SJRYC Clubhouse. Entry Fee is \$50.00 if paid by Friday 9 June 2017 via online registration. Entry Fee is \$60.00 if paid on the day of the event.

Your entry and payment represents that the yacht being registered carries at least \$300,000 of liability insurance.

3. Check-In: It will be required that a representative from each yacht come to the main bar on the ground floor of the SJRYC Clubhouse to check-in between 9:30AM – 10:00AM EDT on the day of the event.
4. Eligibility: The SJRYC Rhumblin Regatta is a PHRF race with Sections for Spinnaker and JaM competitors. It is open to all boats with a valid LMPHRF Certificate. If you do not have a current valid LMPHRF Certificate, a handicap will be assigned with a 10% penalty against similar sisterships or the yacht's prior issued PHRF certificate, at the discretion of the Principal Race Officer. Assigned handicaps are not subject to competitor initiated review or protest.

Final Section splits will be announced via the Special Sailing Instructions on race day.

5. Notices to Competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the lobby or on the grounds of the SJRYC building and prior to the day of the event posted at [www.rhumblinregatta.com](http://www.rhumblinregatta.com). Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located by the Rhumblin Bar, next to the swimming pool at the SJRYC. If a postponement is signaled ashore, an audible warning signal will be made not less than 15 minutes after AP (two flags) is lowered. The AP flag may be substituted by a number flag as indicated at the skippers meeting.

6. Skippers Meeting will be held at 10:30 AM EDT Saturday, 10 June 2017 at the SJRYC at which time any Section breaks will be announced. The warning signal for the first section is planned for 11:55 AM EDT with the first start scheduled at 12:00 Noon EDT which will be the warning for the next section and so on. The class Section flags will be provided at the Skippers Meeting.

7. Class Starting Sequence: We will plan to start Sections in the following order: JaM first, then Spinnaker; however, the Race Committee reserves the right to announce a change in the starting order.

8. Racing Area, Course, and Marks, and Missing Mark Rule: The racing area will be around the permanent markers of the SJRYC Sail Racing Fleet as well as possible additional inflatable markers. A course chart will be distributed and the course will be announced at the Skipper's Meeting. All marks will be cylindrical swim buoys or inflatable markers. All marks must be rounded if within visual

range of the published location. In the event of a missing mark, Rule 34 is amended such that if a mark is missing from the published location a "virtual GPS rounding" shall be made by rounding the published position of the missing mark." A competitor making such a mark rounding must notify the race committee via VHF, channel 69, immediately after doing so.

9. Starting, Finishing Lines, and Starting Procedure: The starting and finishing lines will be between the Committee Boat and a buoy. The Sound Signal Starting System of Appendix Q will be used.

10. Time Limit: The time limit for each Section will be five (5) hours for the first boat to finish. Boats finishing more than 60 minutes after the first boat finishes in their respective Section will be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35.

11. Broadcasts and Change of Course after Starting: All radio broadcasts will be made on VHF channel 69. All yachts will be required to monitor VHF channel 69 during the race. Change of course will be by VHF radio ONLY on channel 69. In the event of a course change, it will be called before the lead boat reaches the mark where the change will take place. A course may be changed for one section but not all sections, for example shortening the course for JaM and not Spinnaker Sections

12. Protests shall be delivered to the Race Committee within 30 minutes after the race committee boat docks. The protest time limit and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after the race in the Board Room of the SJRYC. The decisions of onsite protest will be final, and not open to appeal.

13. Scoring will be Time-on-Distance. This is a single race Regatta with multiple sections. The winner will be determined using the LMPHRF Time-on-Distance formula.

14. Withdrawal: No yacht is to leave the race course after starting without communicating to the Race Committee either visually or via VHF radio on channel 69.

15. Awards will be awarded to top three yachts in each section. Awards presentation will proceed at 6:00 PM EST at the SJRYC.

16. Buffet Dinner will be served from 5PM to 8PM at the SJRYC. Entertainment will be from 7PM to 10PM.

17. Free Dockage is available at SJRYC, but call ahead if your yacht requires more than 6ft draft to help us dock you. Dockage is also available at the West Basin Municipal Marina (call Harbormaster 269-983-5432). Visitors will be permitted to raft at the SJRYC.

18. Disclaimer of Liability: Competitors participate in the Regatta entirely at their own risk (see USSA rule 4, Decision to Race). The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or before, during, or after the regatta.

19. Insurance: Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000 per event or the equivalent. Registration via Regatta Net for the event serves as confirmation of this coverage. A copy of the insurance certificate is to be provided by the boat owner at the Regatta check in for any boat registering late at the event on race day.

20. Photographers and TV Rights: Competitors give absolute right and permission for any photographs or video footage taken of themselves or their competing boat to be published in any media whatsoever; for either editorial or advertising purposes, or to be used in press information.

21. Further Information: The SJRYC Rhumbline Regatta will be conducted under the “Clean Regatta” guidelines for certification by Sailors for the Sea conservation organization.
